by more than 30 delegates including Town Planners, Architects, Engineers and other professionals from Haryana, Punjab and Chandigarh.



- 2. The study has brought out the current problems being faced by the people living in the surroundings of the River Ghaggar being caused due to improper utilization of available open land which otherwise has large potential for development as a beautiful riverfront.
- 3. It can act as a potential for not only tourists visiting the area but also the local residents of tri-city.

4. The main strategies to adhieve is to understand the river flows, identifying preferred activities, defining edge conditions and levels to manage water flows, identifying phases that can be implemented mow, raising awareness, interest and sense of ownership.

The implementation of the above relevant points would go a long way in solving the delicate issues related to the Ghaggar River.
